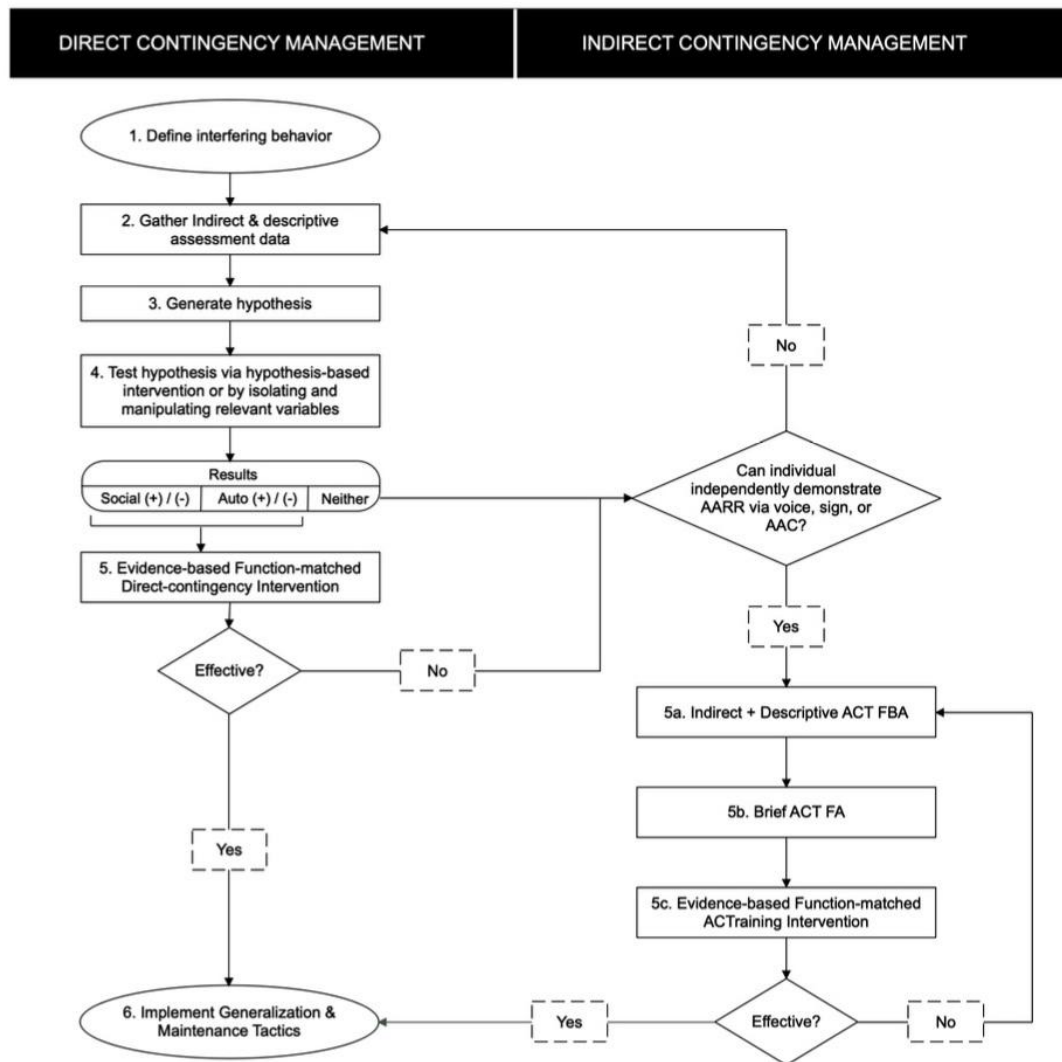

Note: This graphic depicts a current decision-making framework for addressing interfering behavior in the context of ABA treatment. Psychotherapists unfamiliar with the left column, a strategy that ABA practitioners regularly use to uncover behavior-environment relations, may not need to use these strategies. However, these strategies have been found to augment the psychotherapeutic approach. For ideas, see Kohlenberg & Tsai (1994) or Ong, Hayes, & Hofmann (2022).
